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MESSAGE FROM CHIEF

As 2013 is now in the rear view mirror, it is important to reflect on the outstanding public service the men and women of the Maricopa Police Department have provided to our citizens, businesses, visitors and commuters through our city. It is a time for me to reflect on how honored I am to serve with these sworn officers, civilians and volunteers; striving to exceed our goals while making the City of Maricopa the safest community in the state. This 2013 Annual Report is only a snapshot of accomplishments your police department members achieved.

We have realized another year of reduction in Part 1 crime (Homicide, Sexual Assault, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary and Theft). While national reports indicate an uptick in these crimes, Maricopa PD has realized a 2% reduction from 2012 and an astounding 17% from 2011. Utilizing the Compstat crime-fighting philosophy and intelligence gathering strategies, personnel are deployed more efficiently. This has all been accomplished while staffing levels have remained constant at the sworn officer level but communication throughout the organization has improved. We remain committed to being good stewards of your funding.

The Maricopa Police Department values input from our citizens and emphasizes transparent communication. We are grateful for the citizens who show up at "Coffee with the Chief". We realized one of the most successful "Shop with a Cop" events due to outstanding citizen participation. We initiated the first Citizens Public Safety Academy and have now reached out to community stakeholders with a Chief's Civilian Advisory Board. These opportunities have increased direct communication opportunities for all community members and have allowed us to hear your voices in becoming an even better police department.



MESSAGE FROM CHIEF

We have much to look forward to in the upcoming year. MPD will begin contributing and receiving crime-fighting information from law enforcement agency partners through the use of CopLink. This allows us to receive "near real time" information from participating agencies throughout the country; primarily the Southwestern States. Career criminals will come to understand they cannot cross jurisdictional boundaries to victimize citizens of Maricopa under the guise of anonymity. We will begin a "pilot program" utilizing on-body cameras during DUI taskforce operations. Our partnership with MUSD will strengthen with the addition of School Resource Officers at each of the two Middle Schools as well as the High School.

We are very excited to begin the process of building a police sub-station. The station will be located on the same property as the Copper Sky Regional Park and provides a public safety connection to our residents on the southern side of the city. We intend the sub-station to be open for public interaction twenty-four hours a day and will include a Community Room for citizen use. The station will also house our very own communications operation of 911 call takers and police dispatchers.

The men and women of the Maricopa Police Department understand the importance of citizen participation and we realize our successes are not possible without your help. We thank you the citizens, fellow city employees, elected officials and City Manager for your continued support. We remain loyal to our vision of making every contact excellent. Please Stay Safe!!

We strive to accomplish these objectives without prejudice, with the highest of integrity and with the support of the citizens we serve.

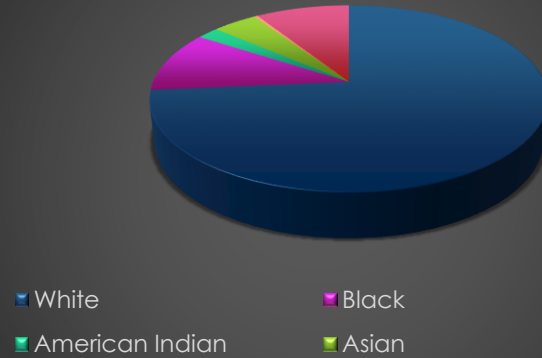
GOAL STATEMENT

 - Increase media exposure related to inattentive driving and DUI driving

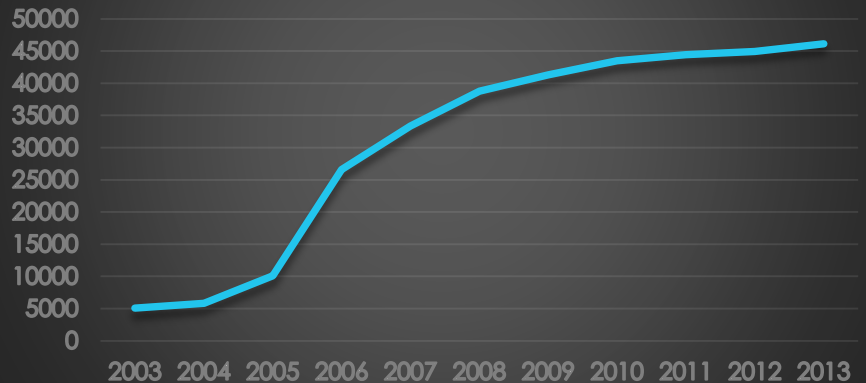

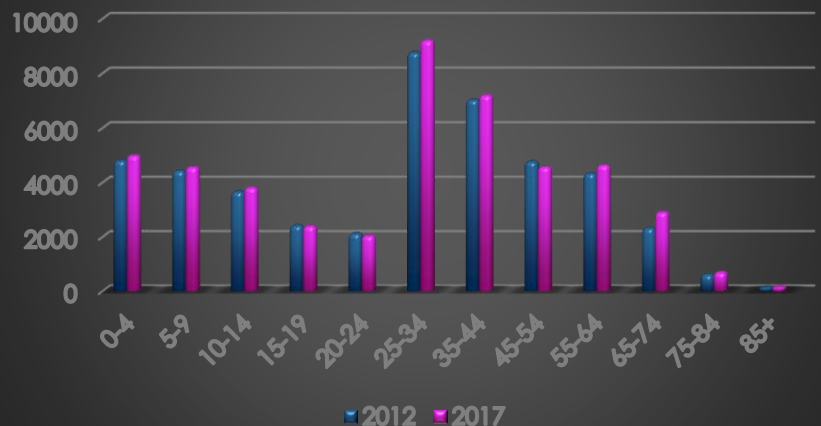
Race by Ethnicity



City of Maricopa Population Growth

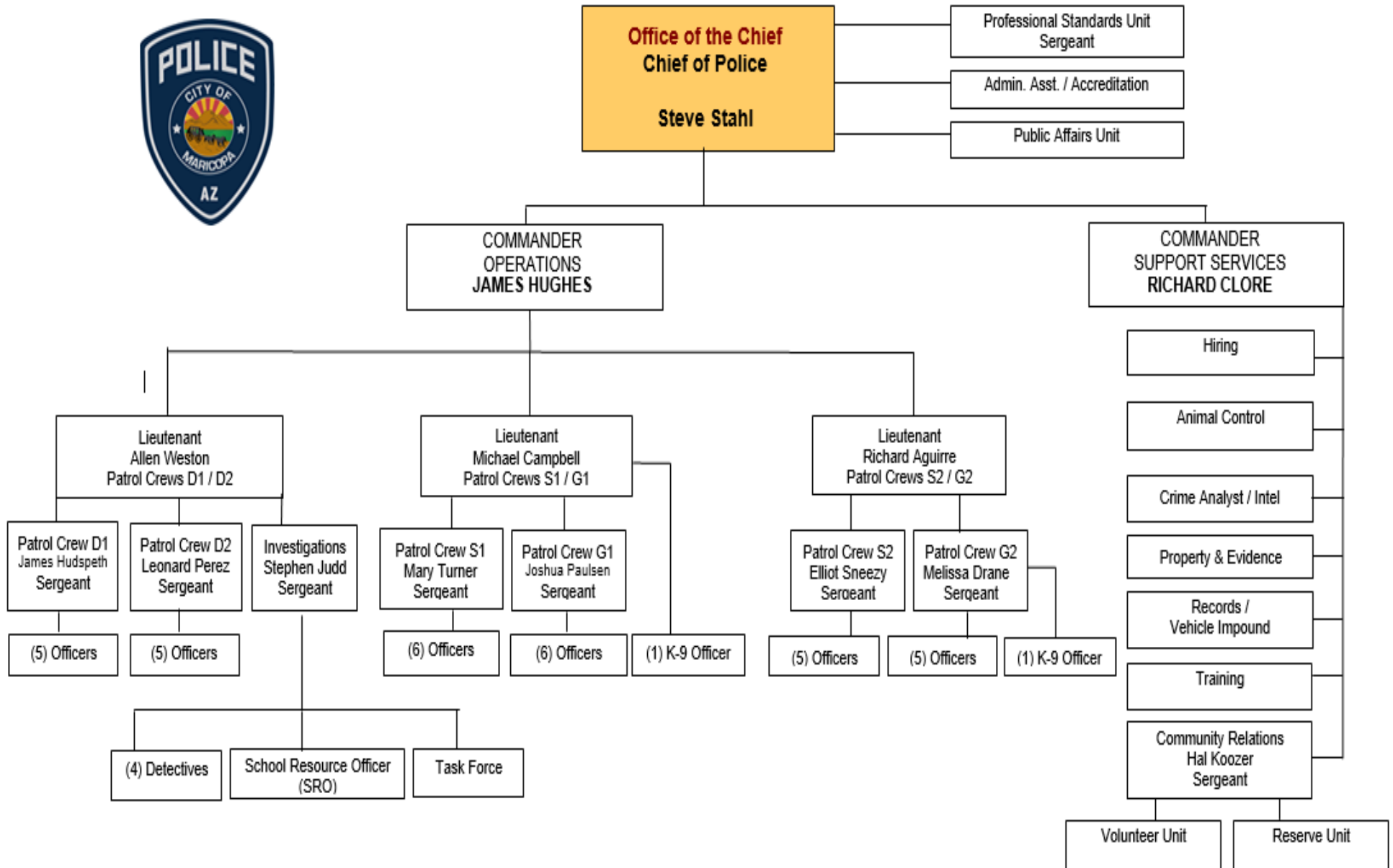


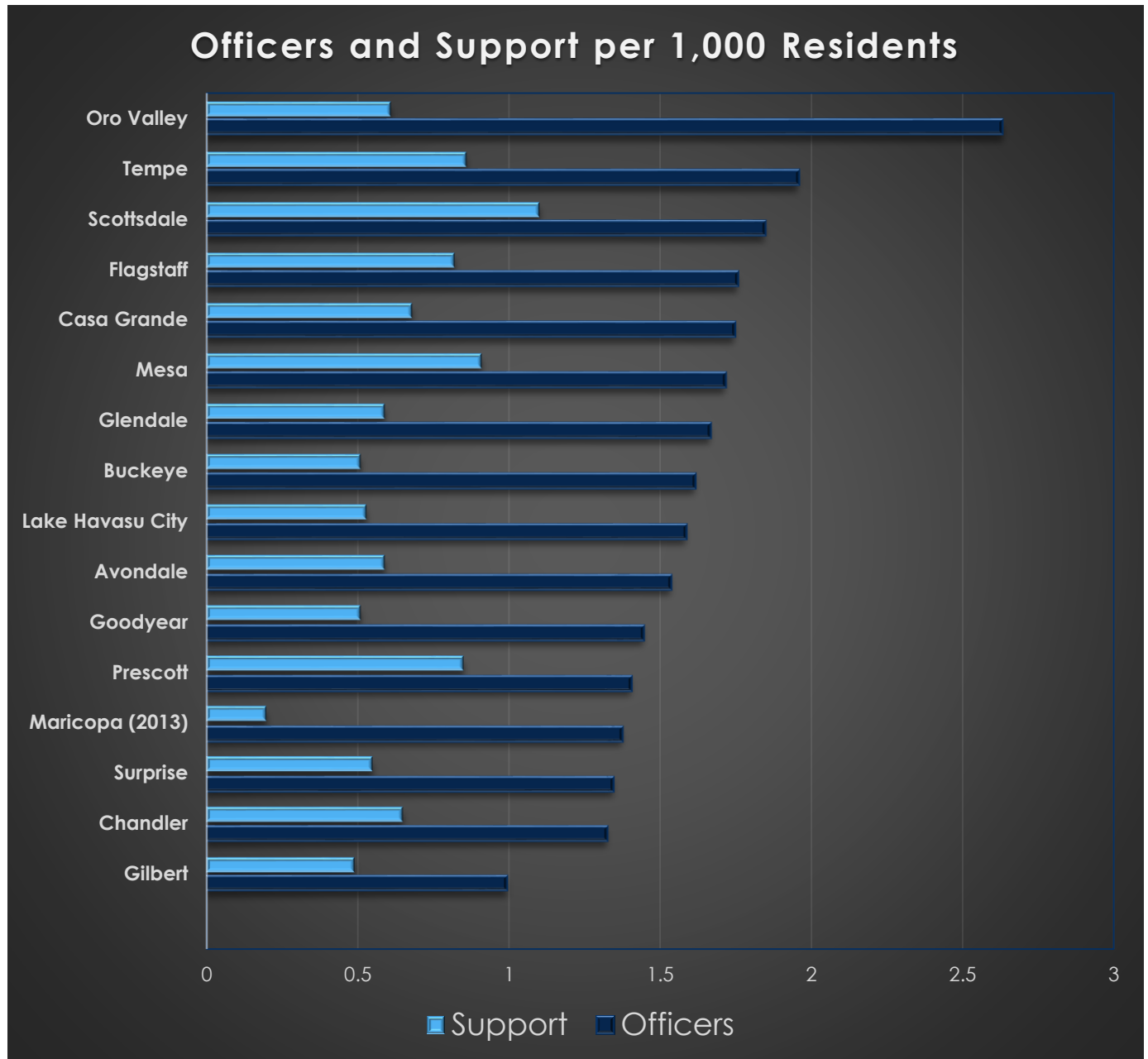
Population by age

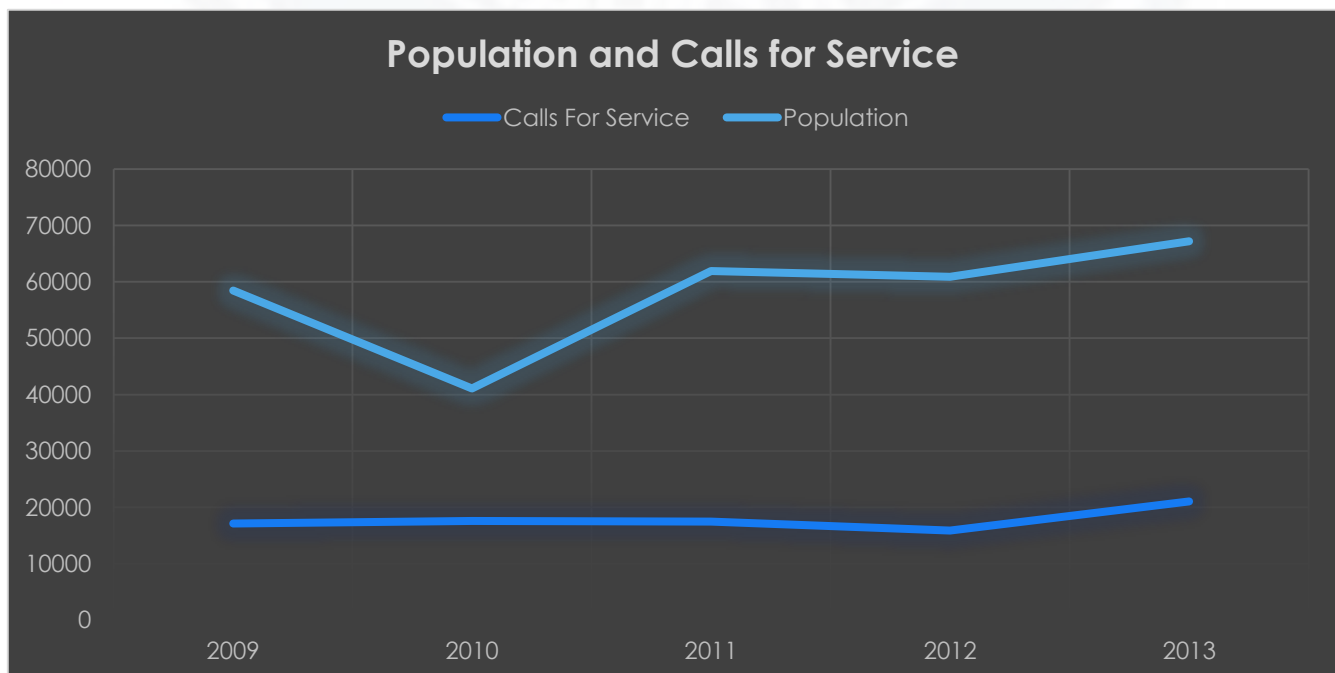

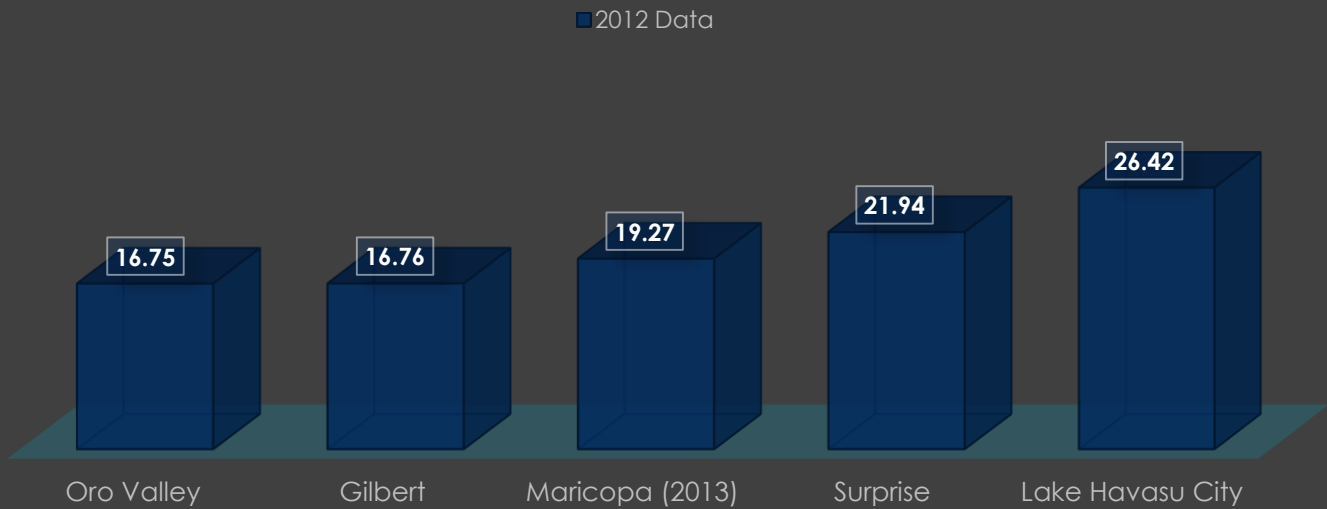

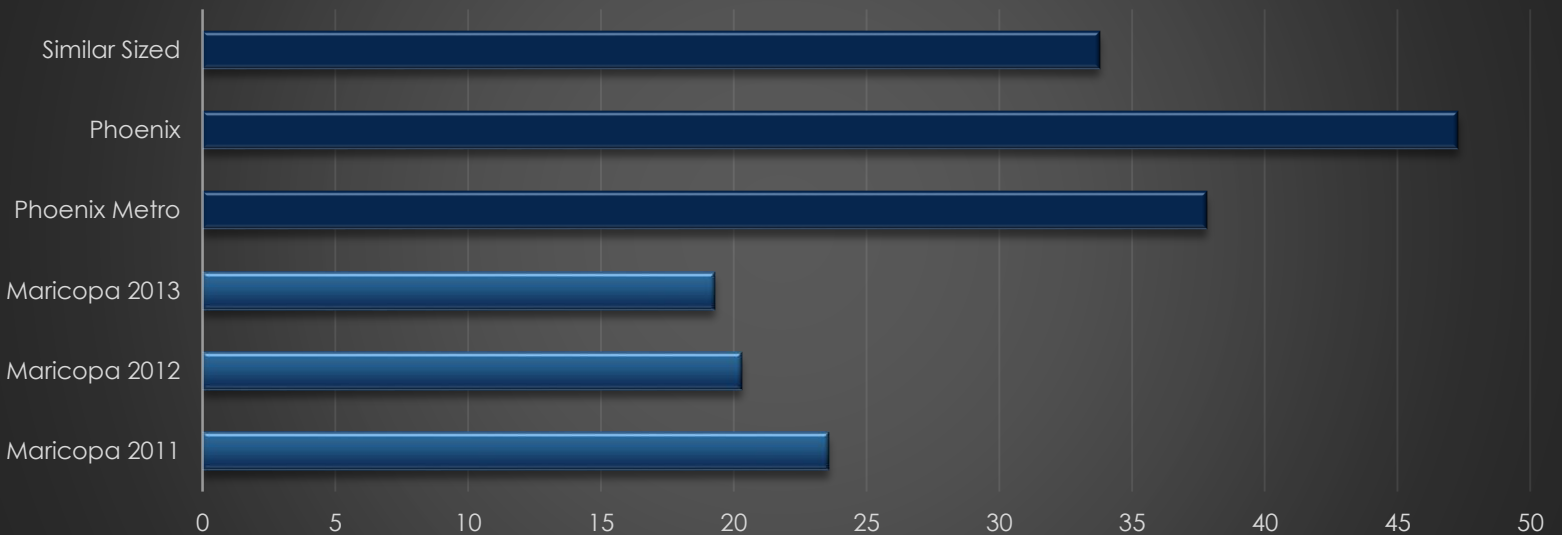
CRIME PER 1,000 RESIDENTS



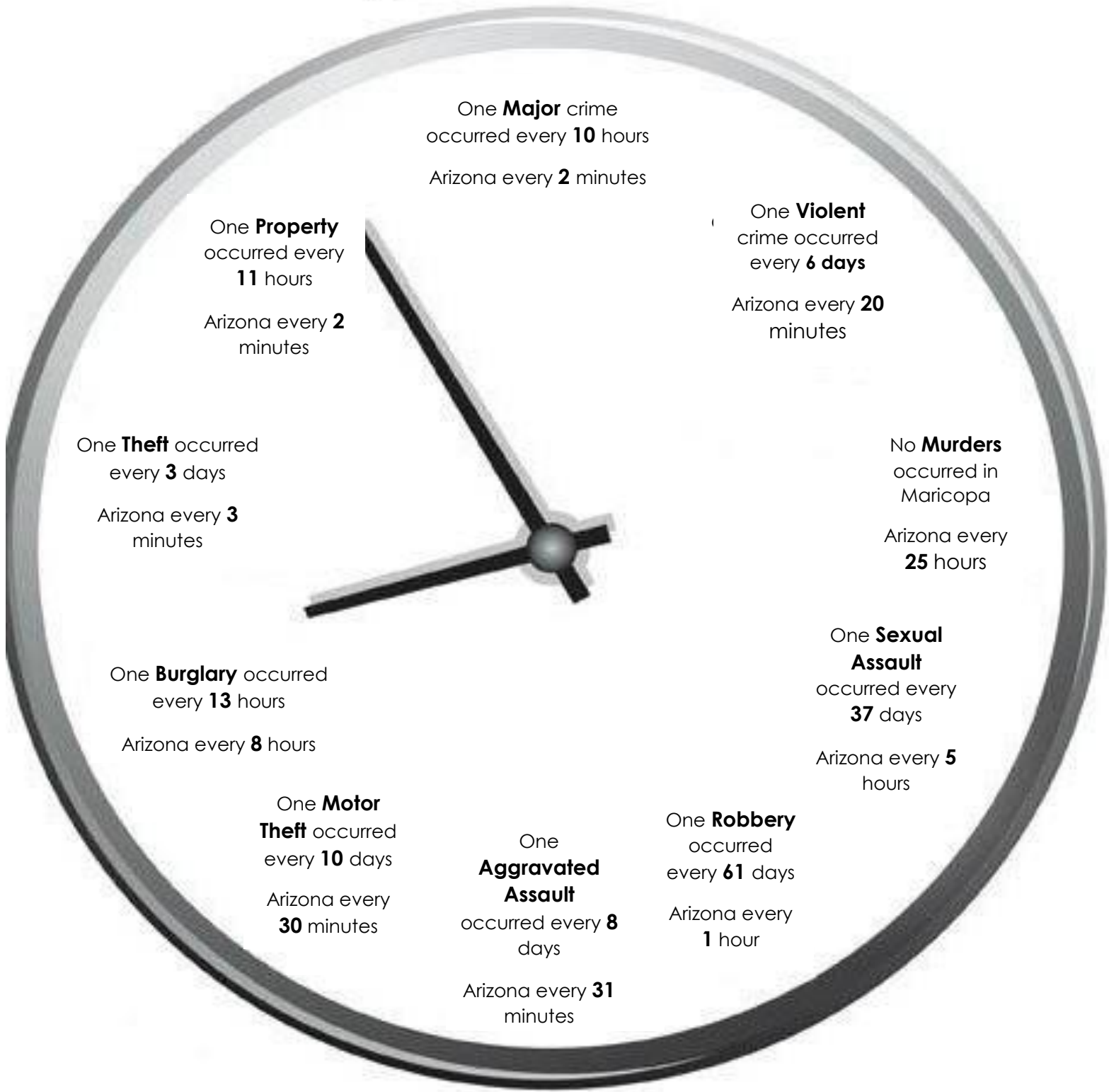
PART 1 CRIME PER 1,000 OF 5 SAFEST CITIES

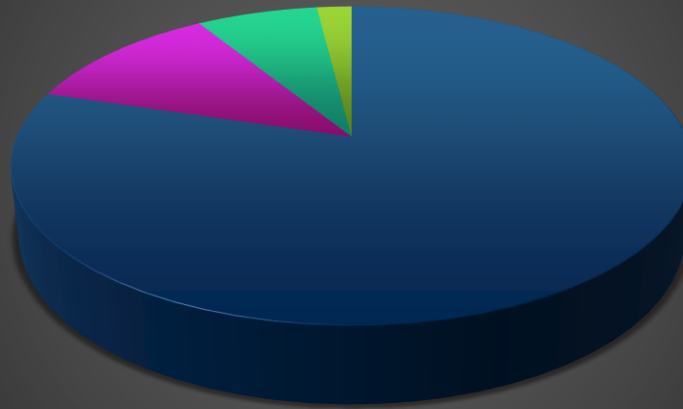

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Each year the Maricopa Police Department tries to find new, inventive ways to get involved with the community and citizens.

Maricopa Police Department participated in its 2nd annual "Shop with a Cop program". In coordination with local companies like Native New Yorker and Great Western Bank in Maricopa, the MPD was able to assist many children in need. The coordinated effort resulted in \$10,000 raised in order to take 48 kids on a Wal-Mart shopping trip



The City of Maricopa hosted its 2nd annual Get Arizona Involved in Neighborhoods party. GAIN is hosted by Maricopa PD Crime Prevention Team, in conjunction with Maricopa Fire Department, to encourage neighborhoods to get involved in block parties. It is a joint effort between citizens and Maricopa to install a block party committee within all neighborhoods



COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Maricopa Police Department hosted its first annual Citizen's Public Safety Academy. Citizens were invited to participate in an 11-week course that incorporated the day-to-day job requirements of police officers and firefighters. Students were able to learn traffic enforcement, impaired driver investigation, collision investigation, detective investigations, and defense/patrol tactics. Every student was also given the opportunity to ride-along with an officer.



Maricopa Police Department is also full of citizens, who make up our growing VIPS program. Under the Volunteers in Police Services, MPD employees 117 volunteers. These fine men and women assist in all areas of the department, from preserving evidence to setting up special projects with our community. Our volunteers are also heavily involved in our Victims Assistance Program (VAP). Without our volunteers, we wouldn't be able to handle the needs and desires of our growing city. MPD is always looking for new faces around the department.

MPD Records Unit

For this award, the MPD decided to award the collective efforts of the records unit. This past year has truly been on the most productive years for the MPD. Officers began to fully utilize CompStat, which has greatly increased the workload within records. The increase includes updating all the DPS validations such as stolen vehicles, missing persons and arrest warrants. In addition, the records department has taken on tow impound hearing, alarm permits, and pretrial packets

The records department collectively audited 2,300 department records to verify that the departments Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) was accurate and that the reports met the high expectations that the MPD has set for themselves. The records manager, Tracey McAtee, has worked to seek out problem areas and has established positive solutions which helped to make the PD run smoother and with a high level of efficiency. Her unit includes Karen Capps and Ronile Goddard. The records department also includes a volunteer, Christine Fuller, who works almost every day.

The timeless service of all of these employees has been spectacular. Their dedication, commitment and enthusiasm have been a source of strength and motivation for the entire department. It is an honor to award the records unit with Civilian Employee of the Year 2013.

Officer of the Year

Officer Arielle Cohen

Since Officer Arielle Cohen's arrival with MPD in July of 2012, she has performed her duties in an outstanding manner. Officer Cohen was selected as the new school resource officer for Maricopa High School, in which she drafted an operational plan for a K-9 search of the MHS campus.
