City of Maricopa Development Fees Report for Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2017 Project Information

Parks Development Impact Fee

This fund is used to account for parks development projects funded by development impact fees imposed on new development. The City expended \$60,000 from parks impact fees for a lawn mower in fiscal year ended June 30, 2017.

Library Development Impact Fee

This fund is used to account for library development projects funded by development impact fees imposed on new development. The City has no expenditures from library impact fees in the fiscal year ended June 30, 2017.

Public Safety Impact Fee

This fund is used to account for police development and public safety projects funded by development impact fees imposed on new development. The City expended \$38,189 on fire communication equipment and vehicles, in fiscal year ended June 30, 2017. Future planned projects include radios and other communication equipment.

Transportation Development Impact Fee

Transportation DIF infrastructure projects can be used for Facilities located in the service area, including arterial or collector streets or roads that have been designated on an officially adopted plan of the City, traffic signals and right-of-way and improvements thereon. Honeycutt Road at Seven Ranches (South) – The project will provide for a minimum of four travel lanes on Honeycutt Road from Porter Road to White & Parker Road.

SR347 Overpass Project – Honeycutt Road to MCG Highway – The project consists of land acquisition and preparation, and design and construction. This project is well underway and is progressing as planned. MCG Highway Interim Improvements – This is a master description for a series of projects to improve the MCG Highway over the next fifteen years. The City budgets each fiscal year for projects under this improvement plan. The City expended \$4,631,336 from transportation impact fees roadway projects in the fiscal year ended June 30, 2017.
