City of Maricopa Development Fees Report for Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2018 Project Information

Parks Development Impact Fee

This fund is used to account for parks development projects funded by development impact fees imposed on new development. The City expended \$241,500 from parks impact fees for park lighting in fiscal year ended June 30, 2018.

Library Development Impact Fee

This fund is used to account for library development projects funded by development impact fees imposed on new development. The City has no expenditures from library impact fees in the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018.

Public Safety Impact Fee

This fund is used to account for police development and public safety projects funded by development impact fees imposed on new development. The City expended \$24,378 on radios in fiscal year ended June 30, 2018.

Transportation Development Impact Fee

Transportation DIF infrastructure projects can be used for Facilities located in the service area, including arterial or collector streets or roads that have been designated on an officially adopted plan of the City, traffic signals and right-of-way and improvements thereon. Smith Enke & Porter Road Intersection and Chase to White & Parker Improvements — this project consists of installing a traffic signal at a very busy intersection which has been completed and also providing necessary traffic management to ensure safety of travelers and needed 4-lane roadway improvements. The City expended \$45,368 on this project from transportation impact fees roadway projects in the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018.

Bowlin Road - Hartman to Murphy (Tortosa) Half Street Improvements — this is a half street improvement to the principal arterial standard. This will entail paving two through lanes and a continuous two-way left turn lane from Hartman Road to Murphy Road. The City expended \$20,160 on this project from transportation impact fees roadway projects in the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018.

Edison Road Extension – this project consists of paving 7,920 linear feet of Hartman Road which will improve mobility in the area north of the Union Pacific Rail Road tracks and west of

State Route 347. The City expended \$17,458 on this project from transportation impact fees roadway projects in the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018.

CMAQ Farrell and Porter Roads — this project consists of three grant proposals to the Maricopa Association of Governments for federal funds under the CMAQ program to pave roughly 4.8 miles and 9 lane miles. All three grant applications received awards totaling \$2.7 million for the bulk share of construction costs while the City shares in the design costs. The City expended \$148,887 on this project from transportation impact fees roadway projects in the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018.
