Justification

Currently, the dispatch center has three working positions to answer 911/non-emergency admin phones and/or as a dispatch position. Based on projected growth of the city, call volume is expected to increase. Due to limited positions we can only have three dispatchers on at one time. With the projected increase in call volume, special events in the city, police special details requiring a separate channel, with increase in staffing numbers, we believe a 4th dispatcher position is needed. A 4th position, would allow potential expansion of services to the dispatch center such as providing dispatch services to other jurisdictions or moving the answering of the city's main number to the dispatch center, thus freeing up city hall staff. The position will need both phone and radio to be fully complete. This project will be completed in phases, beginning with the installation of the radio panel. The second phase would include the installation of the Vesta phone, which could be added in a future CIP request.

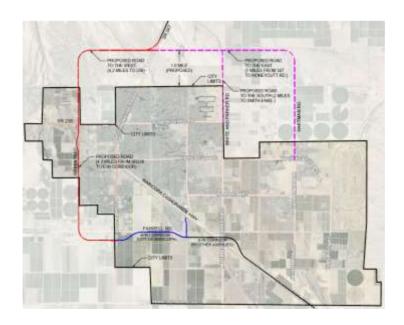

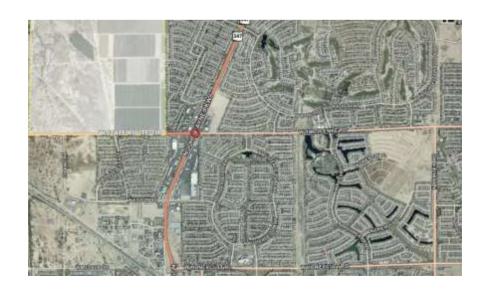
