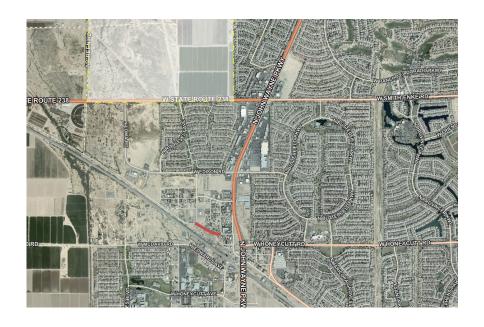

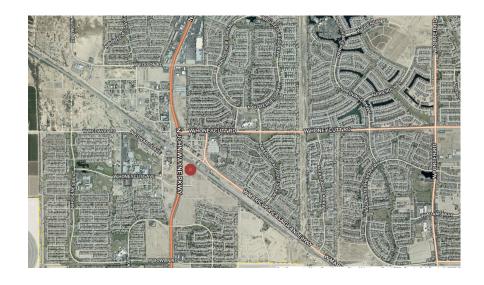

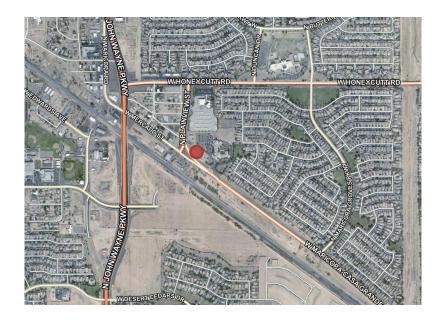

Staff need to check the chemical levels on an hourly basis. The process of checking and adjusting takes at least 2 hours/day. A new PPM system (Part Per Million) will control the chlorine level automatically in the pool. This will allow much more efficient control system of the chlorine usage. Chemicals have gone up 50%-%60 over the past year. Our current chemical budget is \$27,000 but has risen to \$48,000. This will also reduce staffing costs by 2 hours/day. This new system will also allow staff to control the pool system remotely and solve issues without having to come in to the facility.

The Fire Department needs to replace 33 of the current inventory of 43 portable radios that are no longer supported by the vendor, Motorola, and are up to 10 years old. The department has been transitioning from the Motorola APX7000 to the current version AXP8000 in the CIP projects for upfitting new fire trucks at an average of 5 radios per apparatus for a total of 10 radios. With an upcoming pause in CIP Apparatus purchased, the need to expedite a replacement plan is needed.

Justification

The current portable radio model (APX7000) that our members are using is no longer supported or offered by the vendor as they transition to the new APX8000 model. We have purchased ten portable radios over the last two fiscal years in the CIP upfitting costs of new apparatus, and we do not project any new apparatus purchasing for at least three years.

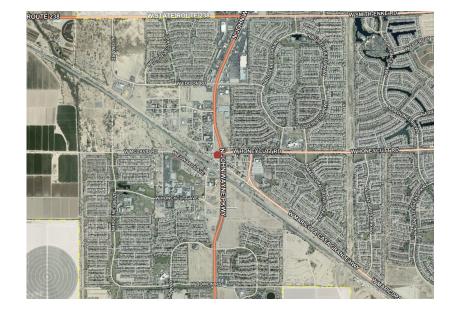
